STEP ELEVEN

"Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out."

...Although referred to as the second maintenance Step, Step Eleven does introduce new action - the action of seeking through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God... An important note to make is that this Step guides us with the words prayer and meditation, not prayer or meditation.

TRADITION ELEVEN

"Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films, and TV. We need guard with special care the anonymity of all AA members.'

It is important to recognize that relationships sometimes change as we grow in Al-Anon.

In order to continue growing, it may become necessary to change

Sponsors. Sponsorship is not a lifelong commitment; letting go is not a sign of failure".

Sponsorship is:

- A relationship built on equality, anonymity and trust.
- A commitment to practice healthy communication not based on intimidation or demands.
- An agreement to recover and grow together not to struggle in isolation. A spiritual relationship with no strings attached.

THE IMPORTANCE OF USING YOUR GROUP FINANCIAL CODE

Al-Anon's Tradition Seven: "Every group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

Why make a contribution?

Contributions cover each Group's rent and other expenses. The Seventh Tradition is essential at every level of Al-Anon service. It is both a privilege and a responsibility for Groups and members to ensure that not only their Group, but all service levels remain self-supporting. This keeps Al-Anon free of outside influences that might divert us from our primary purpose of supporting families and friends of alcoholics.

Why is it important to use Financial codes?

Unnecessary pressure and extra workload is applied to the Area Secretary and Treasurer positions when Groups' use incorrect codes or worse, no code at all. If a contribution has no code at all, it will now be assumed that this is an 'anonymous' contribution and will not go towards your Groups' overall contribution.

What is the Group code made up of?

The first three letters of your suburb or district, plus the first three letters of the meeting day, plus the time with am or pm, plus the type of transaction, as per below:

- Don (donation)
- Lit (literature)
- AssEE (Assembly Equalised Expense)
- ZoomEE (Zoom Equalised Expense)
- Eg:Sydney City Tuesday
- SydTue12pmDon

Monaro District Literature: "MonaroLit (for some groups that have a Face 2 Face meeting at the same time as a Zoom meeting, please put "F" or "Z" after the time)

When sending money to Area for donations, buying literature, or paying equalised expenses Assembly Zoom for or costs, please remember to use the Financial Codes listed here in the "Reference" section or "Send a Message to the Organisation" section of the bank payment or GiveNow site, so that the Area Treasurer can identify payment and attribute the transaction to the correct type. Also, you must do a separate transaction for donations, Literature payments, assembly expenses, or Zoom contribution.
